Building a home for Evans

Background Progress so far What next?

In December 2012 the leadership team and trustees agreed to start supporting Senior Pastor Evans Luwi and his family.

This included £250pcm to pay rent on a modest house in Solwezi.

The landlord increased the rent in April 2013 to £300pcm

And again in July 2013 to £350pcm

In April 2013 after John and Richard's trip to Solwezi, we had started to look at the posibility of building Evans a house.

In May 2013 we agreed to support the build.

£20,000 over 2 years.

Progress so far

We were advised that £10,000 would be sufficient to complete the house to a point Evans would move in.

In July we sent an initial £6,000

After progress photographs were received at the end of August, a further £4,000 was sent



Evans and his family moved in September 2013.


