This included £250pcm to pay rent on a modest house in Solwezi.

And again in July 2013 to £350pcm

In April 2013 after John and Richard's trip to Solwezi, we had started to look at the possibility of building Evans a house.

In May 2013 we agreed to support the build.

£20,000 over 2 years.

We were advised that £10,000 would be sufficient to complete the house to a point Evans would move in.

In July we sent an initial £6,000

After progress photographs were received at the end of August, a further £4,000 was sent

Very few state school places

ZMK 165,000 per month (£20)

Most schools are private

ZMK 535,000 per month (£65)

# Beacon of Hope Community School



Average Zambian family

6 children

Cost of state education for average family

ZMK 990,000 per month (£120)

Maths teacher monthly salary

ZMK 1,868,680 per month (£230)

# Beacon of Hope Community School



40% of Zambian children are orphans

15% of Zambian children are double orphans

26% of adults are HIV+

# Beacon of Hope Community School



Pupils completing primary education in Solwezi area

8.7% (m)      7.5% (f)

Adults with no education in Solwezi area

16.5% (m)      23.8% (f)

Repitition rate

2.3%



The median age at first birth  
increases with level of education.

Women with no education  
have their first birth six years earlier  
than women who have attained a higher level of education.

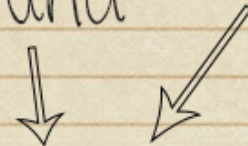
